## About Seminar

The birth day of Siddha Agathyar as per the Tamil calendar is observed as Siddha Day every year. This year it falls on 26th December 2018. To mark the occasion, Siddha Clinical Research Unit (SCRU), New Delhi, a unit of the Central Council for Research in Siddha (CCRS), is organizing a seminar on Management of Vector Borne Diseases through Siddha system.

The Siddha system is known for its holistic approach, covering the preventive, promotive, curative, rejuvenative and rehabilitative approaches of healthcare.

Siddha texts mention 64 types of fever. After detailed studies, experts have identified correlation of signs and symptoms of some of these types of fever with some types of vector borne fever of the present age. Thus, chikungunya is seen to match with vatha suram, dengue fever with pitha suram, and swine flu with kaba suram. These studies have led to Siddha medicine coming to the rescue of thousands of patients in Tamilnadu during the Chikungunya, Dengue, and Swine Flu outbreak from 2008 onwards. Nilavembu Kudineer - a poly herbal Siddha decoction played a major role in Tamilnadu during the above mentioned epidemic outbreaks and aided in prevention of such diseases throughout the flooded areas. Government of Tamilnadu supporting Siddha Department and spread the information about the benefits of Siddha medicines in both treatment and prevention of such diseases among the public through print and electronic media.

Apart from Nilavembu Kudineer, Siddha texts also mention numerous medicines which are useful in the management of flu like illnesses. CCRS has drafted treatment protocols for management and prevention of Dengue and Chikungunya. In CCRS, collaborative projects are also in progress related to Dengue and Chikungunya. CCRS also conducts special OPDs in all their units for management of Dengue, Chikungunya and Swine Flu (vector borne diseases).

Delhi NCR is one of the areas of high incidence of vector borne diseases like Dengue and Chikungunya in India. This Seminar will be helpful in spreading awareness of preventive and treatment measures in Siddha for vector borne diseases in the Delhi NCR Area.

## About CCRS

Central Council for Research in Siddha (CCRS) is an autonomous organization of the Ministry of AYUSH, Government of India which is situated in Chennai. It is the apex body in India for the formulation, development and promotion of research on scientific lines in Siddha system of medicine. It has one Central Institute (Chennai), two Regional Institutes (Pondicherry, Trivandrum), three Clinical Units (Palayamkottai, New Delhi and Bangaluru) and one Medicinal Plant Unit at Mettur near Salem.

## About SCRU, New Delhi

Siddha Clinical Research Unit, New Delhi is one of the peripheral units of CCRS. It was established in February 2016. It offers general and varmam OPD along with the special NCD (non- communicable diseases) OPD services on every Monday and Geriatric OPD on every Tuesday. It also provides nilavembu kudineer daily for prevention and treatment of flu like illness.

SCRU, New Delhi also offers extended OPD services at All India Institute of Ayurveda, Sarita Vihar and AYUSH Wellness Clinic, Rasthrapati Bhawan, New Delhi. Other activities of the unit include its Swasthya Rakshan Siddha OPD services at R.K Ashram, NanakPura, and Delhi Tamil Sangam, RK Puram. Various IMR research projects are in progress under the aegis of SCRU, New Delhi.
