Oral presentations are invited for the Pre-Siddha day event –National conference on Strength of Siddha Medicine for Communicable diseases on 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> December 2021

- Siddha system of medicine in the management of Vector borne diseases
- Post COVID management through Siddha system of medicine.
- Harnessing the preclinical models for communicable diseases.
- Infectious diseases -- prevention, control and care through Siddha system of medicine.
- Anti-microbial activities of Siddha drugs.
- Preparing a research protocol in line with pandemic mitigation.
- Literature evidences of communicable diseases in Siddha system of medicine.

- The first Author of the selected presentations will be informed to be present physically on specified time.

### **Guidelines for abstract preparation and submission**

- Title: Times New Roman, Font 12, Bold
- Author: Name of authors with affiliation of each author and email ID of presenting author. Times New Roman, Font: 10, Italicize the presenting author
- Only Structured abstract is preferred: Background / objectives, methods, results, conclusion, 5 keywords, Times New Roman, Font 12, single spacing, all headings bold. Not more than 250 words
- Only original unpublished research articles / case reports will be accepted.
- Registration for conference is mandatory for oral / poster presentation.
- Scientific committee shall review the abstracts and acceptance will be communicated through mail.
- Session number and other details will be sent to the Presenter concerned in due course through mail.
- Certificate will be awarded to the author and co-authors those who have registered for the event and have participated in the event.
- The decision of scientific committee will be final.
- The total time of the presentation should not exceed 8 minutes (plus 2 minutes for discussion).
- Manuscripts prepared as per the guidelines of Journal of Research in Siddha Medicine (official journal of CCRS) will be highly preferred for publishing in the upcoming JRSM issues after peer review.

### **The instructions for the preparation of Presentation (for selected submissions)**

- All presenters must prepare PPT, outlining key findings and conclusions.
- It should be clear, well-organised, informative and concise and should include all necessary information (title, methods, research, literature, etc.)
- Presenters must be mindful and respectful of their time slot and not exceed the time constraints.
- Updates may be shared during the presentation but no modifications can be made to the submitted abstract.
- Make sure that any photographs or figures being used in the PPT are with sufficient size so that they are clearly visible, with a minimum 300-dpi resolution.
- The number of photographs should be limited to only those that are essential and relevant for the oral presentations (preferable not exceeding 4-6 photos).
- Do not submit any photographs or pictures that are not relevant to the text, such as cartoon characters, etc. Photographs for case report presentation should be in standard quality for all extra-oral/intra-oral photos and pre-treatment/post-treatment photos.
- Radiographs view must be in good quality and have minimal distortion.
