About the Symposium

This symposium is aimed to tackle the burden of Diabetes which is high and increasing globally, and in developing economies like India, mainly fuelled by the increasing prevalence of overweight/obesity and unhealthy lifestyles. According to the ICMR-INDIAB-17 national crosssectional study estimates, the prevalence of diabetes and prediabetes in India is 101 million and 136 million, respectively that are much higher than earlier estimates in 2019 (77 million), which is expected to rise to over 134 million by 2045. Approximately 57% of these individuals remain undiagnosed. Uncontrolled diabetes leads to increased risk of vascular disease and much of the burden of type 2 diabetes is caused by macrovascular (cardiovascular (CV), cerebrovascular, and peripheral artery disease) microvascular (diabetic retinopathy, nephropathy, and neuropathy) complications.

Diabetic complications are the significant cause for increased premature morbidity and

mortality among individuals with diabetes, leading to reduced life expectancy and financial and other costs of diabetes leading to profound economic burden on the Indian health care system. To curb the epidemic of diabetes and its associated complications, there is a need for a multipronged strategy including equipping the AYUSH students and physicians to handle the epidemic.

In this regard, Central Council for Research in Siddha, National Institute of Siddha, Directorate of Indian Medicine and Homeopathy, Govt. of Tamil Nadu and SEED Trust is jointly organising the symposium on "Recent Trends and Siddha Management of Diabetes.

About the Organizers

Central Council for Research in Siddha (CCRS)

The Central Council for Research in Siddha (CCRS) was established w.e.f September 2010 through the bifurcation from the erstwhile Central Council for Research in Ayurveda and Siddha (CCRAS).
